- 9/20 Proscenium Theater to explain the college application process including using Naviance along with the Common Application, applying to CSU, UC, private and out-of-state schools, and requesting letters of recommendation and transcripts. *Note: The Common Application, Naviance and other applications have changed this year so we encourage students to review and begin any application materials as soon as they are ready, but not to submit anything until they have attended the presentations to assure that they have accurate information. Seniors who have not registered for Naviance can login by clicking "I need to register" and entering the student ID# for New User. Senior parents may login by entering the student's ID# followed by a letter p (ex: 123456p). For returning users who forget passwords, click the forgot your password link on the Naviance page. If you need assistance, please contact Darlene Burton.*
- 9/19 <u>12th Grade Parent Presentation</u> 6:00 -7:00 pm; Counselors will present to 12th grade parents in the Proscenium to cover the college application process. Parents who are unable to attend will be able to view the PowerPoint on the <u>Presentation Index</u> on the *CCA Counseling* website.

- 9/29 Deadline for seniors requiring a letter of recommendation for Early Decision or Early Action applications to complete Brag Packet and turn in a completed FERPA to their counselor and teacher(s).
- 10/01 <u>CSU</u> application becomes available online. (The <u>UC</u> application opened August 1.)
- 10/04 <u>CSU APPLICATION WORKSHOP</u>: 8:30- 9:30 AM in the Proscenium. CCA will host a CSU Application workshop to walk seniors through the CSU application process.
- 10/11 <u>LAST DAY TO DROP A CLASS WITH A 'W'</u> Per SDUHSD Board Policy students who drop a class will receive a withdraw/no credit on the transcript. This "W" does not factor into GPA calculation.
- 10/11 The <u>PSAT</u> will be administered to 11th graders only. If you would like to make a donation you may do so online at the <u>CCA Webstore</u> or at the Finance Office. The suggested donation for the PSAT is \$28.00. Please make checks payable to SDUHSD.

College Visits in the College & Career Center

SENIORS: A list of all college visits can be found in Naviance under the Colleges tab, right-hand menu, view all upcoming college visits. College visits are also posted on CCA's site calendar. College visits are reserved for 12th grade students. College visits will open to Juniors in spring. (Parents may attend college visits; please sign-in as a visitor in the Admin office.)

TO ATTEND A COLLEGE VISIT:

In the view all upcoming college visits section of your Naviance account, select the college visit you would like to attend and click Sign Up. You will be directed to a page to submit your request. Most visits occur during class time, so you will need to print a CCA College Visit Pass at home, to have signed by your parent and then by your teacher(s) whose class(es) you will miss. If you are 18 years of age or older you do not need a parent signature; you do, however, still need a teacher(s) signature. The pass can be found in the Document Library on your Naviance home page. Bring the pass with you to the visit. Allow yourself at least 2 days prior to the visit to obtain required signatures. If you have an unscheduled period during a college visit, you do not need a pass.

REMINDERS FOR SENIORS

You should have submitted your <u>Name Verification for Diploma</u> form with Raven Readiness materials. If you did not, you may bring it to the Registrar's office. Diplomas are ordered in January.

The 12th grade Student & Parent Presentations are available to view in the <u>CCA Presentation Index</u>. You are encouraged to refer to the presentation as you work on your college applications.

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS TESTING INFORMATION

<u>REMINDER TO SENIORS</u>: The November test date is the last test date that San Diego State and San Jose State will accept. The December test date is the last test date you are able to take the ACT or SAT for most colleges. Please verify this information with your specific colleges.

- SAT October 7, 2017 is the next test date for the SAT and SAT Subject Tests. Regular registration is closed. Late registration (online & phone) closes September 27; late fee applies.
- ACT October 28, 2017 is the next available ACT test date. The Regular Registration Deadline is September 22. Late registration closes October 6; late fee applies.

CCA's school code is 050893. Students requiring an SAT/ACT *fee waiver* can obtain one from the Counseling Secretary, or from Ms. Burton in the College & Career Center.

FREE TEST PREP: Test prep books for SAT/Subject Tests, ACT and AP exams are available for check out in the College & Career Center. Please also visit the <u>CollegeBoard</u> and <u>ACT</u> websites for many *Free* Test Prep resources.

SCHOLARSHIPS

ALL GRADES: Scholarship Opportunities are posted below. Most scholarships are for seniors, but many are for other/additional grade levels. Juniors and Seniors can view details and instructions in their Naviance account under the COLLEGES tab, third section, SCHOLARSHIP LIST. Descriptions below convey the basics; visit the linked website for details.

NOTE: For scholarships that require letters of recommendation: Respectfully ask a staff member in person, (not by email) whether s/he will write a letter of recommendation at least 3 weeks in advance of a deadline, and provide him/her required documents, including a FERPA.

- <u>Questbridge National College Match</u>: Seniors; Deadline 9/27; up to/over \$200,000; low-income, high achieving (academically) students.
- **<u>2017 Wendy's High School Heisman</u>**: Seniors; Deadline 10/2; \$500 \$10,000; Student Athletes who excel in the classroom, on the playing field, and in their communities.
- <u>United States Senate Youth Program</u>: Juniors & Seniors; Deadline 10/4; \$10,000 and a one-week, all expense paid trip to Washington, D.C.; must be nominated.
- <u>2017 ISEC (International Science Essay Competition Dartmouth:</u> All grades; Deadline 10/5; \$100 \$500; Essay Contest for students interested in science and writing.
- <u>YoungArts:</u> Sophomores, Juniors, Seniors; Deadline 10/13; up to \$10,000; for emerging artists (several disciplines).
- <u>Spotlight Awards:</u> All grades; Deadline 10/16; \$5000; performing arts students.
- **2017 BBB Torch Awards Essay:** Juniors, Seniors; Deadline 10/17; \$500 \$1,500; essay contest.
- <u>Horatio Alger Assoc. Scholarship</u>: Seniors; Deadline 10/25; \$7,000 \$25,000; need-based for students with critical financial need and perseverance in overcoming adversity.
- <u>Coca-Cola Scholars:</u> Seniors; Deadline 10/31; \$20,000; merit based.
- <u>Voice of Democracy</u>: All grades; Deadline 10/31; \$1,000 \$30,000; video essay contest.
- <u>Bennington Young Writers Awards Competition</u>: Sophomores, Juniors, Seniors; Deadline 11/1; \$250 \$500; writing contest (poetry, fiction or nonfiction.
- **<u>2018 Prudential Spirit of Community Awards</u>**: All grades; Deadline 11/7; \$1,000 \$5,000; for students making a difference in their communities (community service award).
- <u>2018 Regeneron Science Talent Search</u>: Seniors; Deadline 11/15; up to \$250,000; prestigious science research project competition.

- Discover: The Diversity Experience at WPI: Seniors Underrepresented minorities & students interested in diversity; free is selected; program dates Nov 9-10, deadline to apply 9/29/17.
- Journey to Bucknell (Overnight Program): Seniors high achieving, traditionally underrepresented (including Asian-American); free if selected; program dates October 29 31; deadline to apply 9/29/17.
- Whitman College Fall Visit Program: Seniors from underrepresented socioeconomic, racial and cultural backgrounds; free is selected; program dates Nov 5-7; deadline to apply 9/30/17.
