REMINDERS FOR SENIORS

Use the many college application resources provided by the Counseling Dept., including the <u>College App. Guide by Type</u>, <u>College App FAQs</u>, <u>Four-year College Checklist</u>, and <u>Creating and Finalizing Your College List</u> to make sure that you are completing all the necessary steps and entering the correct information for CCA and our courses and schedule.

Important:

- Send official SAT/ACT scores to all colleges that require them. Some colleges allow you to self-report your ACT/SAT scores, and send official scores only after you have been admitted and intend to matriculate. Verify the policy for each of your schools.
- Pay careful attention to all emails and instructions from each college. They may request additional materials or note that they have not received required items.
- Teachers and counselors are *not* notified of any changes to your Naviance or Common App college lists. If you need to make changes, you must see your teacher(s)/counselor in person to follow-up.
- If you need to make a correction to a submitted UC application:

- If you need to make a correction to a submitted CSU application: *
 - Send an email to the admissions office at each individual campus to which you applied. Include your individual CSU campus Student ID# (if available-- for SDSU your Student ID# is your Red ID#), full name, date of birth and indicate that you are a first time freshmen for the Fall 2018 semester. List additional information/correction(s) you want to make to the application. Be very clear and specific in your updates. *NOTE: If you submit a change after the deadline, SDSU and Cal Poly SLO cannot guarantee that they will use the updates for your admission. If you need to contact CCA's SDSU or Cal Poly SLO representative, you may obtain her/his email from Ms. Burton or your counselor.
- If updating your academic record, please include the school name, department and title, semester the course was taken or being taken, and the grade earned or "in progress/planned." If updating SAT/ACT exam results, be sure to list the entire test scores and include the date on which you took the exam (month and year).

• If you are applying for financial aid, make note of the financial aid deadlines for each of your schools, and which forms each require. All schools require the <u>FAFSA</u>; most private schools also require the <u>CSS Profile</u>. A Guide to Completing the 2018-2019 FAFSA is available on the <u>College & Career Center</u> web page under *Financial Aid*.

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS TESTING INFORMATION

- March 10, 2018 is the next test date for the SAT and SAT Subject Tests. The Regular Registration Deadline is February 9. The Late Registration Deadline is February 28 (online & phone); late fee applies.
- <u>ACT</u> <u>February 10, 2018</u> is the next available ACT test date. The Regular Registration Deadline is January 12. The Late Registration Deadline is January 19; late fee applies.

CCA's school code is 050893. Students requiring an SAT/ACT *fee waiver* can obtain one from the Counseling Secretary, or from Ms. Burton in the College & Career Center.

FREE TEST PREP: Test prep books for SAT/Subject Tests, ACT and AP exams are available for check out in the College & Career Center. Please also visit the CollegeBoard and ACT websites for many *Free* Test Prep resources.

SCHOLARSHIPS

ALL GRADES: Scholarship, Contest and Internship opportunities are posted below. Most are for seniors, but some are for other/additional grade levels. Juniors and Seniors can view details in their Naviance accounts under the COLLEGES tab, third section, SCHOLARSHIP LIST. Descriptions below convey the basics; visit the linked website for details.

NOTE: For scholarships that require letters of recommendation: Respectfully ask a staff member in person, (not by email) whether s/he will write a letter of recommendation at least 3 weeks in advance of a deadline, and provide him/her required documents, including a FERPA.

Active:

- MIT Inspire!: All Grades; national high school research competition in the Humanities; students can compete as an individual or in teams. Deadline to submit Intent to Participate form: 12/08.
- AXA Achievement Scholarship: Seniors; for seniors who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in their activities in school, the community or the workplace. Deadline 12/15; \$10,000 \$25,000.
- <u>THINK Competition (MIT)</u>: All grades; nationwide competition for students to share innovative and impactful STEM projects; \$200 \$500 plus \$1,000 to build your project; Deadline: 1/01/2018.
- John F. Kennedy Profile in Courage Essay: All grades; \$500 \$10,000; political essay contest. Deadline 01/04;
- <u>GE-Reagan Foundation Scholarship Program:</u> Seniors; \$10,000 \$40,000; for strong academic students who demonstrate at school/workplace/community the attributes of leadership, drive, integrity and citizenship. Deadline 1/04/2018.
- <u>Peter Chortek Leadership Award:</u> All grades; \$5,400 Stipend; community service award for Jewish high school students in San Diego. Deadline 01/05.
- <u>US JCI Senate Foundation Scholarship Program:</u> Seniors; \$1,000; competitive only top two ranked per state are submitted for review. Deadline 1/05/2018.
- <u>Safe Jobs for Youth Poster Contest:</u> All grades; \$100 \$300; for California high school students; create a poster with a theme related to "Safe Jobs for Youth." Deadline 1/08/2018.
- <u>Safe Jobs for Youth Video Public Service Announcement (PSA) Contest:</u> All grades; \$100 \$300; for California high school students; create a video (no more than 3 minutes) addressing one of the basic 6 things California teens should know to keep safe at work. Deadline 1/08/2018.

- <u>Diller Teen Tikkun Olam Awards:</u> All grades; \$36,000 (fifteen awards of \$36,000 each); for Jewish teens (may self-identify as Jewish) for exceptional leadership and engagement in service projects to make the world a better place. Deadline 01/08.
- Asian & Pacific Islander America Scholarship Fund: Seniors; \$2,500 \$20,000; for Asian and/or Pacific Islander ethnicity with financial need focus on first generation and low income. Deadline 1/11/2018.
- Girls Impact the World Film Festival: Sophomores, Juniors, Seniors; \$1,000 \$5,000; students may submit 3-6 minute short films that address global women's issues (open to males and females). Deadline 1/20/2018.
- <u>2017-2018 Prindle Institute High School Essay Competition:</u> All grades; \$\$300; essay contest on an ethics-related topic this year's topic focuses on the Electoral College. Deadline: 1/25/2017.
- <u>California Coastal Art & Poetry Contest:</u> All grades; \$100 gift card to an art store; students are invited to submit artwork or poetry with a California coastal or marine theme. Deadline: 1/31/2018.
- <u>Princeton Prize in Race Relations:</u> All grades; \$1,000 and all-expense paid weekend to a national symposium on race at Princeton University; for students who have had a significant positive effect on race relations in their schools or communities through their volunteer efforts. Deadline 1/31.
- NEW San Diego Foundation 2018-2019 Common Scholarship Application: Seniors; Over 100 scholarship opportunities; scholarships typically range from \$1,000 to \$5,000. One online application to apply for multiple opportunities. Criteria varies by scholarship. Deadline: 2/1/2018.
- New Northrop Grumman Engineering Scholars: Seniors interested in pursuing engineering careers; two scholarships for San Diego students; each scholarship \$2,000 \$8,000 (\$2,000 renewable for four years). Deadline: 2/05/2018.
- San Diego County Salute to Education Scholarship: Seniors; \$1,000 and a chance to win a Ford Vehicle; local scholarship a minimum of 150 scholarships will be awarded; various academic categories, including vocational. Deadline: students must turn in application to Ms. Burton by 2/14/2018 so applications can be mailed by CCA by the postmarked deadline of 2/16/2018.
- <u>Brad Fowler Memorial Scholarship:</u> Seniors; \$5,000 (five scholarships to be awarded) with the opportunity to renew for a second year with an additional \$5,000 scholarship; for seniors who have overcome personal obstacles associated with drugs or alcohol, and who have a strong commitment to athletics and to continuing their personal growth; nomination required. Deadline: 2/23/2018.
- STEM Scholarship for Aspiring Commercial Drone Pilots: Students must be a least 16 years old; \$299 \$450 value
 scholarship provides free access to the online Part 107 test prep course; requires teacher letter of recommendation. No deadline indicated.
- NEW MAEGA 2018 Scholarship: Seniors of Mexican or other Latino heritage; \$500 \$2000 (typically); students have a GPA of 2.0 or higher and have financial need. A MAEGA info session will take place at CCA on Tuesday, December 5th at 12:30 PM in the College & Career Center. Deadline: 3/1/2018

ENRICHMENT/VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

ALL GRADES: Enrichment, volunteer and internship opportunities. Some are age/grade specific. Juniors and Seniors can view details in Naviance under the COLLEGES tab, second section, ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS.

ALL GRADES: This is the time of year when colleges begin to advertise their summer programs. **Many summer programs have early deadlines.** It is impossible to list all programs offered by all colleges. If you are interested in a particular college, search by (college name) summer programs for high school students 2018. These colleges have notified CCA that their summer programs are now accepting applications: Cornell, USC, Miami University Summer Scholars Program; UT Austin, Tisch (NYU) Summer High School.

Active:

- UCSD Social Innovation Sprint #2: All grades; January 20 & January 27: The Social Innovation Sprint is a two-day event where UC San Diego faculty will guide teams of high school, undergraduate, and graduate students through the design thinking process to develop solutions to pressing social issues. Key topics covered include empathizing, ideating, prototyping, marketing, and pitching. This year's focus is climate change. This is a collaboration with Scripps Institute of Oceanography, UC San Diego Jacobs School of Engineering, and the Rady School of Management. Cost: \$349; scholarships available. Prizes will be awarded.
- Ohio State Buckeye Vet Prep Camp: Current freshmen, sophomores, juniors: Six day residential program at Ohio State University for students interested in exploring veterinary medicine; \$700 covers lodging, meals, instruction and social activities; \$40 non-refundable application fee. Program dates; 6/24 6/29, 2018. Deadline to apply: 12/15/2017 at 5:00 EST.
- 2018 High School Diplomats at Princeton University: Current Sophomores, Juniors; HSD is a ten-day program at Princeton University for American students to interact and forge friendships with Japanese students; FREE to attend if selected; Program Dates: July 25 August 5, 2018; Deadline to apply: 1/09/2018.
- NEW Simons Summer Research Program at Stony Brook University: Juniors; Simons is a competitive summer research program for (current) high school juniors interested in science. High school nomination is required and CCA can nominate up to three candidates. Nomination is on a first-to-ask basis. Interested students should talk to their high school alpha counselor or to Ms. Burton. Program dates: June 25 August 7, 2018. Deadline to submit an application is 1/17/2018, so students should ask to be nominated no later than Monday, December 11, 2018. (CCA has already had one request so two spots remain.)
- New Bank of America 2018 Student Leaders Program Paid Internship: Juniors, Seniors; Eight-week paid summer internship; competitive for exemplary young people with a passion for improving their communities. Deadline: 2/02/2018.
- Yale Young Global Scholars Program (Summer 2018): Students ages 15 17 at time of application (Class of 2019 or 2020); seven interdisciplinary summer pre-collegiate experiences; dates vary by academic offering; Tuition & fees: \$6,000; selective program; Deadline to apply: 2/06/2018.
- <u>Boston Leadership Institute (Summer 2018):</u> Grades 9 11; high-achieving high school students interested in STEM; three-week research program (\$2200 Tuition & Residential \$3997); one-week programs (\$599 Tuition and Residential \$1198.) Deadline to apply: varies by program.
- New Reproductive and Oncofertility Science Academy at UCSD (ROSA): Current female 10th & 11th grade students. The curriculum focus in oncofertility a field in medicine that addresses the fertility needs and quality of life issues for young cancer patients. This competitive program accepts 12/14 high school girls in San Diego. Program dates: June 26 August 11, 2018, but program takes place most Saturdays from 8am 4pm and most Wednesdays from 5pm 8pm. Cost: fee of \$600. Deadline to apply: no later than 2/09/2018.
- <u>USC Bovard Scholars:</u> High-achieving high school junior with low family income; most accepted are first in their family to attend college. Three-week residential summer program at USC to help students gain admission to and succeed at the nation's top universities; no cost for those selected. Program dates: July 15 August 4, 2018. Deadline to apply: 2/16/2018.
- New SERA (Science & Engineering Research Academy) at UCSB: Current 9th, 10th or 11th grade students. Application opens December 15th. Four-week residential summer program to introduce research in STEM fields to qualified high school student s. Program dates: June 24 July 21, 2018. Cost: \$75 application fee plus \$8,199 Residential Student Tuition. Some scholarships available. Deadline to apply: 3/02/2018 but you are encouraged to apply early as applicants are reviewed and accepted as applications are received.

New UC Santa Barbara Research Mentorship Program: Current 10th or 11th grade students. Application opens December 15th. Competitive six-week residential research mentorship program; students are paired with a mentor and choose a research project from a large list of disciplines. Program Dates: June 24 – August 2, 2018. Cost: \$95 application fee plus \$10, 899 Residential Student Tuition. Deadline to apply: March 15, 2018, but you are encouraged to apply early as applicants are reviewed on a rolling basis.
