Selecting the edit icon for any of the colleges in your "applying to" list will open the edit applications page displaying all of the schools to which you applied. Update the "Result" and, if applicable, the "App Type." If you did not apply to a school in your list, select "Withdrawn" under "Result."

## **COLLEGE ADMISSIONS TESTING INFORMATION**

- SAT March 10, 2018 is the next test date for the SAT and SAT Subject Tests. Regular registration is closed. The Late Registration Deadline is February 28 (online & phone); late fee applies.
- <u>ACT</u> <u>April 14, 2018</u> is the next available ACT test date. The Regular Registration Deadline is March 9. The Late Registration Deadline is March 23; late fee applies.

CCA's school code is 050893. Students requiring an SAT/ACT *fee waiver* can obtain one from the Counseling Secretary, or from Ms. Burton in the College & Career Center.

Students should have their full social security number when completing the application, a copy of their transcript (unofficial) or access to Aeries. (Students who do not have a social security number can still apply.)

Students who attended the Application/Assessment Workshop OR who applied to MCC online and completed the assessment process should attend the Orientation & Course Selection Workshop. At this workshop you will receive information about the tools available to you to choose classes, and you will select your first semester courses. You must have your SURF ID to attend the Orientation & Course Selection Workshop.

- <u>FIRST Scholarship Opportunities</u>: Juniors & Seniors; database of *FIRST* Robotics and *FIRST* Tech Challenge scholarships. Students can search by college location, grade level, program type, focus. Deadlines vary.
- <u>The National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences</u>: Seniors; \$1,000; for seniors who intend to pursue a baccalaureate degree in communications with emphasis on any aspect of the television industry. Deadline 2/26/18.

- <u>North County Italian Assoc. Scholarship:</u> Seniors; \$1,000; must be 25% Italian heritage and have a minimum 3.0 GPA. Deadline to apply: 3/9/2018.
- <u>Sunflower Scholarship (Academic)</u>: San Diego County Seniors with a minimum 2.5 GPA who are actively involved in extra-curricular activities and community service and/or civic involvement. \$1,000 \$5,000. Deadline to apply 3/12/2018.
- New <u>Cabrillo Civic Clubs of CA Scholarship</u>: Seniors; \$500; for students of Portuguese descent; 3.50 minimum GPA, participated in 3 extracurricular activities. Deadline to apply: 3/15/2018.

- New <u>2018 North Island Credit Union</u>: Seniors; \$1,000; minimum 3.0 GPA; evidence of community and/or school involvement. Deadline to apply: 3/16/2018.
- <u>Don Diego Scholarship</u>: Seniors who have participated in the San Diego County Fair and/or other activities associated with the Del Mar Fairgrounds. Four scholarships are offered in each of four categories, and two vocational education scholarships are offered to support students pursuing an AA/AS degree or certificate at a community college or trade school. \$1,000 - \$10,000. ALL GRADES: Enrichment, volunteer and internship opportunities. Some are age/grade specific. Juniors and Seniors can view details in Naviance under the COLLEGES tab, second section, ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS.

ALL GRADES: This is the time of year when colleges begin to advertise their summer programs. Many summer programs have early deadlines. It is impossible to list all programs offered by all colleges. If you are interested in a particular college, search by (college name) summer programs for high school students 2018. ALL GRADES: The <u>California State Summer School for the Arts (CSSSA)</u> application is open. Seven art categories: animation, creative writing, dance, film & video, music, theatre, visual arts. Program is subsidized by the state. Month-long residential program; \$1850 for CA Residents. Deadline to apply: February 28, 2018.

New UCSD Research Experience for High Schools Students: Eight week volunteer program through the San Diego Supercomputer Center – students must be at least 16 years of age on or before June 18, 2018. Students are involved with an established research project. Several UCSD mentors need more than one student intern. Research projects vary considerably. Examples: Molecular Mechanisms of Diseases: cancer, autism, Alzheimer's disease; Auto-Correlation in Seismology Research; Neuroscience Gateway Software Intern; Science Writing & Video Communications Interns. <u>LSSI/Biocom</u>: Paid internships at leading San Diego life sciences companies. Program dates: June 18<sup>th</sup> – August 10, 2018. Must be at least 16 years of age on or before June 25, 2018. This is a very competitive program. Students must be able to commit to 40 hours/week for the duration of the program. Deadline to apply: March 30, 2018 (5:00 PM).

**FOCUS ON:** <u>Clemson University Summer Scholars Program</u>. Many summer programs offered by universities are expensive, primarily because they are 2-4-6 week programs. Clemson University offers one week residential programs for \$1,100 inclusive (room & board, classroom materials, field trips, three meals per day during the week). They also have some unusual offerings: **Pack Camp** – for students interested in the industry of packaging. Students will learn how a product is launched to market and will design their own product and package; **Teachers are Everywhere!** – students will explore the many aspects within the field of education, including industry; **Human-Computer Interaction Through Eye Tracking (HCI)** – students will design and execute short eye-tracking experiments – conducted at Clemson's eye tracker classroom with Gazepoint trackers.

- <u>2018 National Youth Science Camp and the California Dept. of Education</u>: Graduating High School Seniors only two per state; No cost to student. Must have superior academic proficiency in math or the science, and documented leadership ability. Deadline to apply: 2/28/2018.
- <u>Carnegie Mellon Summer Academy for Mathematics and Science</u>: Current Juniors; underserved and underrepresented students including ethnic minority, first gen, low income; six week program June 30 – August 10; no cost for tuition, room and board – there is a cost for textbooks, transportation and recreational expenses. Deadline to apply: 3/1/2018.
- <u>Boston Leadership Institute (Summer 2018)</u>: Grades 9 11; high-achieving high school students interested in STEM; three-week research program (\$2200 Tuition & Residential \$3997); one-week programs (\$599 Tuition and Residential \$1198.) Deadline to apply: varies by program.
- SERA (Science & Engineering Research Academy) at UCSB: Current 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup> grade students. Application opens December 15<sup>th</sup>. Four-week residential summer program to introduce research in STEM fields to qualified high school student s. Program dates: June 24 July 21, 2018. Cost: \$75 application fee plus \$8,199 Residential Student Tuition. Some scholarships available. Deadline to apply: 3/02/2018 but you are encouraged to apply early as applicants are reviewed and accepted as applications are received.

New <u>UCSD – Research Experience for High School Students</u>: See description above. Students must be at least 16 years of age on or before June 18, 2018. Multiple opportunities to be mentored by UCSD faculty as a member of a research project. Offered through the San Diego Supercomputer Center, but opportunities are not limited to computer science fields. Program descriptions can be found <u>here</u>. Deadline to apply: 3/15/2018.

<u>UC Santa Barbara Research Mentorship Program</u>: Current 10<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup> grade students. Application opens December 15<sup>th</sup>. Competitive six-week residential research mentorship program; students are paired with a mentor and choose a research project from a large list of disciplines. Program Dates: June 24 – August 2, 2018. Cost: \$95

application fee plus \$10, 899 Residential Student Tuition. Deadline to apply: 3/15/2018, but you are encouraged to apply early as applicants are reviewed on a rolling basis.
