Disc Golf

Course Name: Disc golf

Course Description/Curriculum:

Can you throw a Frisbee? Do you want to play a game that is impossible to win? Well then the exciting and sometimes frustrating world of Disc Golf is waiting. Think of golf with Frisbee Discs, though the discs are not officially Frisbee Brand. These discs are denser and have a smaller diameter than a traditional Frisbee. Sometimes called Frolf, the goal is to get your disc into a basket in the least amount of throws. At CCA, there are no baskets, so different targets like trashcans and trees will be substituted.

Japanese Culture Class

Course Name: Japanese Culture

Course Description/Curriculum:

The Introduction to Japanese Culture course serves as an opportunity for all students, parents, and Canyon Crest Community members to become responsible global citizens. The course emphasis on modern and traditional Japanese culture will cultivate a deeper understanding, appreciation and respect of Japanese people. Everyone will be immersed in the multitude of perspectives representative of Japan today.

We will survey a wide variety of cultural themes including but not limited to historical and human geography, individuals who made significant contributions, both historical and modern, the impact of technology on Japan in the modern era (1952-present), an examination of social relationships and hierarchy, holiday traditions, local and national festivals and celebrations, leisure-time activities, regional cuisines, traditional and contemporary music, the role of transportation in daily life, and changing trends in clothing and fashion. Students will draw connections between modern Japanese culture and their own.

Students will be able to explain Japanese culture through Anime and games such as pokemon. Students will be able to speak and comprehend very basic greetings and set expressions in Japan typically heard in Japanese restaurants, supermarkets, hotels, airports, train stations, department stores, Japanese high schools, etc. and even in Japanese speaking homes in America. Student will be able to explain and demonstrate the Japanese tea ceremony, Ikebana (flower arrangement), Japanese calligraphy, instruments such as the Taiko and Koto, use of chop sticks, proper etiquettes and mannerism (the do's and don'ts) in regards to: business meetings, dinner table at home, restaurants, stores, shops, proper exchange of greetings, how to wear Japanese traditional clothes, riding the train, bus and taxi, shopping, eating out, etc.

Students will be able to explain how cities and geography influence Japanese culture, lifestyle and products.

Those in attendance, students, parents, community member, etc. will help create the course as it goes along. There are no grades, and no homework assignments.

Surfboard Shaping/Design

Course Name: Surfboard Shaping/Design

Instructor: Mr. Shakeri

Course Description/Curriculum:

This enrichment course is designed with the intention to broaden and enhance the surfing experience. Each and every surfboard design gives a different feel of the waves in the ocean. Some minor design features can produce drastic results. Those who surf have a close relationship with their board. The goal of this course is to provide insight into how the various design features provide a different ride on the waves and an even greater appreciation for the culture we hold close to our hearts.

Over the course of 8-10 weeks the course will cover the evolution of surfing and board design. The students will study the various features that make up the anatomy of board. This will follow with a day of designing templates and learning about techniques in shaping. Once given the background knowledge the students will have the option of taking turns to team shape a board for use in surf PE at the Shapers Studio in North Park. If they desire they can sign to shape their own personal board. Other sessions will include learning about board artwork, a visit to the Mingei Museum, observe glassing and a final day at the beach to enjoy their new creation.

Course Description:
