The School and Community

Canyon Crest Academy (CCA) is an outstanding learning community of approximately 2375 students in grades 9-12 who live throughout the San Dieguito Union High School District. CCA is a public "school of choice" that any student in the district can select to attend. Students are attracted to CCA to pursue specialized education in the arts, sciences, and technology and to participate in real-world application of skills through established partnerships with local businesses and universities. Student achievement is strongly supported by parents and community members, who partner with school staff to enrich the academic experience for each child on our campus.

Since 2004, CCA has been a leader in achievement and performance for the district, with accomplishments extending beyond the classroom as well. Students have earned accolades in diverse extra-curricular activities, such as our nationally-ranked math team; San Diego County Science Fair, Science Olympiad, Siemens Science Competition and Intel Science Competition; our award-winning school publications; visual and performing arts, including a Grammy Signature School Enterprise Award and National Youth Theater Awards; and athletic teams that have competed in statewide championships. Dedicated and talented staff members collaborate across curriculum and embrace technology in support of student learning that responds to evolving student interests and includes specialized and in-depth studies. Students are supported in taking intellectual and creative risks as they engage in their studies, enabling them to be confident, life-long learners. Our students' creativity, commitment and exposure to rigorous academics have uniquely prepared them for success beyond CCA.

Curriculum and Academic Program

Students follow a 4x4 block schedule where they take up to four 90-minute classes per day, five days per week, in each 18 week Fall and Spring term. On this accelerated system, every term-long class is the equivalent of a traditional year-long class and students earn two final grades per class each term. Students who take eight classes can earn up to 80 credits in a year. The 4 x 4 schedule also gives students the chance to take additional electives and explore various disciplines. For students who have a specific area of interest, taking sequential elective or academic classes "back-to-back" in both terms in order to advance their skills and knowledge is a popular option.

Envision/Conservatory

For students who desire to expand their exposure to the arts, CCA offers Envision, a program designed to inspire and train future artists. It is an extensive curriculum with a structured sequence of progressively challenging courses in the following disciplines: Dance, Visual Arts, Humanities, Instrumental Music, Theater, Cinema and Vocal Music. For students who demonstrate exceptional potential and talent, CCA offers Envision Conservatory. Conservatory is a rigorous, audition-only extracurricular program that provides advanced instruction and training supplemented by professional teaching artists.

Standardized Testing Information

SDUHSD is not reporting ACT and SAT testing data for 2020-2021 due to the very small number of scores reported. If a college requires any exam, the applicant will provide score reports directly to the college. For fall 2022 applicants, California State University and University of California, among other schools, will not accept or review ACT or SAT scores at all. As a result of the ACT & College Board organizations canceling multiple administrations due to COVID-19, more than 1,600 four-year colleges and universities will not require students to submit ACT or SAT scores to be considered for fall 2022 enrollment which represents more than two-thirds of the 2,330 bachelor-degree institutions in the United States.

Grades for Advanced Placement (AP) courses are computed on a five-point scale and are designated on the transcript with a plus symbol (+). Honors classes are not weighted, with the exception of Integrated Math III Honors. Other than these weighted courses, CCA does not participate in or recognize any form of academic distinction, including Valedictorian, Salutatorian, National Honor Society or California Scholarship Federation. **CCA does not rank students**.

2020-2021 Distance Learning

2019-2020: Pursuant to San Diego County Public Health Orders, all SDUHSD schools physically closed 3/13/2020 and remained closed for spring term. Beginning 3/23/2020, SDUHSD schools transitioned to a distance learning plan with a focus on following the curricular sequence and course essential learning outcomes, priority knowledge and skills, and a reduced student workload to approximately 50-60% due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. The district issued Credit/No Credit marks as the recommended grading platform. To accommodate later requests for student choice, a second option was added to request distance learning letter grades based on quarter 3 grades as the benchmark. In order to hold all students "harmless," final term grades were based on the 3rd quarter grade which could only be improved by 4th quarter work. Distance learning letter grades are counted toward the cumulative GPA; grades of Credit or No Credit are not counted toward the cumulative GPA. This was a temporary change in grading policy that only applied to Spring 2020 final term grades.

<u>2020-2021</u>: Pursuant to a 7/2020 Governor's order and continuing county monitoring, all SDUHSD schools remained physically closed at the start of the Fall 2020 term and a distance learning model with a return to letter grades and full curriculum was implemented through the second quarter. More information at SDUHSD.net. Per CA Assembly Bill 104, all students in grades 9-12 in 2020-2021 were able to request to change letter grades to credit/no credit. CR/NC marks are not factored into GPA calculation.
