Course Description

AP 3D provides an environment for the dedicated art student to create a college-level three-dimensional sculptural portfolio, or a “body of work” that shows quality, concentration, and breadth (a range of approaches to 3D materials). This portfolio is intended to address three-dimensional design issues. Design involves purposeful decision making about how to use the elements and principles of art in an integrative way considering space. Through a series of assignments and independent-study projects, students will create a portfolio of 10 slides (5 sculptures) that show mastery of concept, composition, and execution (Quality), 12 slides (8 sculptures) that represent the student’s individual interest and exploration of design (Concentration), and 16 slides (8 sculptures) that demonstrate a variety of concepts and approaches in 3-D design (Breadth). For this portfolio, students are asked to demonstrate mastery of 3-D design through any three-dimensional medium or process. While the goal of the course is for each student to develop an individualized concentration in 3-D design, the ultimate goal is to submit a portfolio to the College Board for review and advanced placement and/or college credit at many colleges and universities. While there is not a lot of homework assigned, students are expected to work very hard during class time.

Grading

10% of the student’s grade comes from “Practice Work” (sketchbook, in class practice exercises, presentations, etc.) and “Studio Performance,” which includes the student’s ability to use the valuable class time and resources wisely. 90% of the student’s grade comes from “Presentation Work,” which are major projects.
