Foreign Language Practice TIPS

It is highly recommended that students continue practicing the second-language outside of the classroom on a daily basis, especially during gaps between language courses.

- Read a novel or two over the summer
- Read authentic articles online and summarize them in your own words (written or spoken)
- Listen to music and read/learn lyrics (always look up the meaning of new words that you do not know and write them down)
- Watch shows in the language (i.e. Netflix) [with Spanish subtitles] & summarize
 the events in your own words
- Join a conversation group in your community or online
- Travel to a country where they speak the language
- Listen to the news in the language every day (there are many apps/podcasts in Spanish/French) – practice summarizing what you heard; look-up new vocabulary!
- Be a TA for an upper-level foreign language class
- Attend clubs/events in the foreign language (search online for opportunities in your community)
- Write a letter or journal entries every day
- Practice speaking with a native-speaker or with a friend who also studied the language
